Mark has been featured on CJOB talk radio with Richard Clouthier, CTV News, The Winnipeg Sun, The Winnipeg Free Press, The Canadian Press, The Carillon, CBC Radio, Online chats and other social media platforms fighting to protect our aquifer along with many partnerships of concerned citizens, politicians and environmental specialists. A voluntary referendum was set in motion during the summer of 2023 with nearly 5,000 responding with a resounding 96.4% voting no to the silica project. Mark and Andy also met with Wab Kinew leading up to the last election.
